

## **IN CASE OF EMERGENCY**



## 1. CALL 911

- 2. Put the phone on speaker & set it down.
- 3. Start CPR.



- 4. Tell the 911 operator your address:
- 5. Continue CPR until the paramedics arrive.
- 6. Call the parents:

- O Keep doors leading outside locked.
- O Remain within arm's reach of babies, toddlers, and preschoolers during bathtime.
- O Have children help put away toys and drain the bathtub when bathtime is finished.
- Keep toilet seats down and/or locked when not in use.
- O Keep bathroom and laundry room doors closed when not in use.
- O Drain standing water areas: buckets, sinks, water play tables, pet bowls, etc.

- Only caregivers who are CPR certified can take children swimming.
- O Receive permission from parents to take children into the pool.
- O Keep the pool gate latched and locked.
- O Remove items (chairs, tables, boxes, etc.) that may be used to climb over barriers.
- O If playing outside, stay with the children at all times.
- O If coming inside—even for a minute-bring children with you.
- O Children may not enter the pool until you're ready to join them.
- Older children must always swim with a buddy.
- O Stay within arm's reach of small children at all times.
- O Keep an eye out for fatigued swimmers and ask them to sit on the side to rest.
- O If you get out of the pool, everyone gets out.
- O Floaties are toys, not lifesaving devices.
- O After swimming, remove all toys from the pool and pool deck.
